### Director Report December 2023

- The staff began the Conscious Discipline Approach training. Conscious Discipline is based on seven skills: Composure, Encouragement, Assertiveness, Choices, Empathy, Positive Intent and Consequences. Our staff will be learning opportunities to teach children the social-emotional, and communication skills necessary to manage themselves, resolve conflict, prevent bullying, and develop pro-social behaviors. This training focuses on all seven components. This model also involves bringing the parents into the process and teaching them the skills. This is our goal with communicating what the staff is learning through this training. The first two modules were completed during the month of December.
- A department mentor meeting was held on December 7<sup>th</sup>. This meeting focused on the upcoming state inspection and how leadership could support the classrooms in their department.
- Our Toys for Our Tots collection was a success!! We collected over one hundred toys for families. We appreciate all our families who donated to this wonderful cause. This collection provides children with a relevant opportunity to learn about serving others.
- Our fundraisers raised over one thousand dollars. All our fundraiser profits will be helping upgrade the security system.

# Jesus is Calling


