- I completed classroom observations on March 21st focusing on classroom environment.

Winter is a time when children are often trapped indoors with the monotonous weather. Then, one day, the sun brings heat instead of just light. Flowers begin to appear and trees begin to bud. With months of pent up energy, children everywhere declare their "winter" emancipation. They liberate themselves in celebration of warm weather freedom.

How can parents capitalize on this "mountainous" release of energy? Hear are 10 ways to enjoy spring with your child.

- 1. Create a "letter" garden. Plant flowers in the shape of your child's first initial. This teaches creativity, letter recognition, duty and responsibility, and thankfulness for God's supplies.
- 2. Reading up, then acting out. Each night, read a portion of a story from the Bible. David & Goliath, Samson & Deliah, etc. The family can bring the story to life by acting it out. A great way to play together.
- 3. Lending a Helping Hand. Spring is a time when you can get outside to clean up a winterworn yard. As a family, go out and pick up those fallen branches, rake up the left over leaves, then consider doing a neighbor's yard (maybe an elderly family or a family who is overwhelmed).
- 4. Keeping your head in the clouds. Have your whole family lay on a blanket. Stare at the clouds and tell everyone to say what they see in the sky. Imaginations run wild!!
- 5. Hunting for signs. Take a nature walk and look for signs of spring. Notice the budding trees, the baby bunnies, and the nesting birds. Take a camera or a sketchbook to capture what you see.
- 6. Donating from your "spring cleaning day". Time to clean out and donate. Rarely-played-with toys, outgrown clothes/shoes, books, other not needed items can be donated to your local Goodwill or take to local consignment shop and get a little extra spending money.
- 7. Taking "tweety hike". Go on a nature hike. Pay attention to the birds, the sounds they make, and where they live. Do this very often and have your child try to identify the birds they have already heard or seen.
- 8. Camping Close by-really close by. Pitch a tent in the backyard. Toss a frisbee, tell some stories, and enjoy some s'mores.
- 9. Orating Outside. Choose a book of nature poetry. Read it on a walk or on a deck or porch. Then have the children write a poem of their own.
- 10. Proper priorities. Not matter what, challenge yourself as a parent to stop running, stop chauffeuring, and stop going, going, going. Slow down and smell the roses. Slow down and watch a bunny play. SLOW DOWN!


